# Background

- ◆ SDGs build on the principles agreed upon in resolution entitled “ The future we want” This was a non binding document released as a result Rio conference held in 2012.
- ◆ The SDGs are a bold, universal agreement to end poverty in all its dimensions and craft an equal, just and secure world – for people planet and prosperity by 2030.
- ◆ SDGs adopted by UN in 2015 with 17 Goals & 169 Targets.
- ◆ Came into effect from 1.1.2016.
- ◆ The time period for SDGs is 2016-30.
- ◆ India is signatory of the UN Resolution and committed to implementation of SDGs. Along with 193 Member States at the historic UN General Assembly summit in 2015.

# SDG Vision

- ◆ The new agenda is a promise by leaders to all people everywhere.
- ◆ It is a universal, integrated and transformative vision for a better world.
- ◆ It is an agenda for people, to end poverty in all its forms.
- ◆ An agenda for the planet, our common home.
- ◆ An agenda for shared prosperity, peace and partnership.
- ◆ It conveys the urgency of climate action.
- ◆ It is rooted in gender equality and respect for the rights of all.
- ◆ Above all, it pledges to **leave no one behind**.

- **17 Goals, 169 Targets and 300+ indicators**
- **Addressing three dimension of development; Social , Economic & Environmental**
- **SDGs are guided by three Principles:**
  - Leaving No one Behind**
  - Universality**
  - Integrated Approach to Sustainable Development**

# Progress Made

- ◆ District level **Sustainable Development Goals Implementation and Monitoring Committee** meeting held on **13 January 2020** Chaired by District Collector.
- ◆ Nodal officer is to be nominated in all departments related to indicators of SDGs as per the instructions received from the Directorate. the departments have been directed in the district, Nodal officer has been nominated in some departments and Nodal Officer is yet to be nominated in some departments (lockdown effect) who are constantly being approached.
- ◆ As per the instructions received from the Directorate information related to the departments included in the **District Indicator Framework (DIF)** is to be obtained for Effective implementation of sustainable development goals in the district and to review their progress. For this the concerned departments have been directed for problems related to indicators, information is being collected by establishing contacts at the state level.

# National, State and District SDG Monitoring Mechanism

- ◆ NITI Aayog has constituted a Task Force with NITI, MoSPI, Ministries of Central Government and State Governments as members to oversee the SDG implementation.
- ◆ A High Level State Steering Committee is constituted in State under the chairpersonship of CS for review and refinement of SDGs Indicator Framework
- ◆ **District Level SDG Monitoring and Implementation Committee** Steering Committee has been constituted under the chairmanship of District Collector to review the SDG Indicator Framework and its Implementation in the district.

# Way Forward

- ◆ Development of dashboard for monitoring of SDGs
- ◆ District/Block level Consultation with stakeholders for capacity building of the functionaries Documenting and sharing of best practices SDG wise.
